**【 Teaching English to Children 】**

In this class, students practice various methods of teaching English to preschool and elementary school students, including songs, games and other fun activities. In addition, students learn about and create educational materials, read children's books in English, and study vocabulary and phrases often used by children.


**【 Interactive Communication 】**

In this class, students practice communication in pairs and in groups, through interviewing, taking surveys, discussing topics and working on projects together. Students all learn how to communicate in front of an audience through presentations and how to effectively communicate information through writing.

Languages are always changing! Words and phrases that were once common become old-fashioned and fall out of use, or the meaning of a word may change over time. Young people are always coming up with new expressions, new ways to use words, and even inventing new words! There is always something happening in our language, and you just have to pay attention and listen to find new discoveries. In my research, I like to analyze how languages are used in real life.

**A** I like to listen to podcasts on my way to work. I like to listen to interviews. I like the way that people talk when they are interviewing someone, or when they are being interviewed. There are certain phrases or ways of talking that you often hear when listening to an interview. One of my favorite podcasts is a show called "Everything is Alive." In it, the podcaster doesn't interview people, but instead interviews objects, like bread, or a rental car, or a sock. It's funny, but it's also very philosophical. It makes you think about what it means to be alive and what it means to be human.
